Our History and Mission

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation has supported charitable organizations and initiatives that predominantly target the areas in and around the Paso del Norte Region - El Paso, Southern New Mexico, and Ciudad Juárez. In addition to the Foundation's regional support, it also assists organizations whose programs impact the State of Texas and the nation as a whole.

Charitable giving by the Hunt Family Foundation is focused on healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development.

This report was prepared for the communities we serve, to provide a comprehensive overview of Foundation activity and to ensure transparency in all of our charitable giving.

Long-Term Giving

The Foundation awards multi-year commitments to organizations that emphasize widespread and prolonged impact. To promote program sustainability and to encourage additional community participation, the Foundation increasingly makes multi-year commitments whereby it matches private contributions made to charitable organizations. Since 2004, the Foundation has made commitments to various organizations totaling \$31,939,783.


Year 2012 in Review

Nineteen new, multi-year commitments totaling \$1,957,500 were made during the year. The Paso del Norte Region received 18 of those commitments.


Of the total new commitments, over 50% went to educational institutions. These included over \$250,000 in scholarship programs for students in the Paso del Norte region to attend The University of Texas at Austin McCombs School of Business.

Several commitments were made that support quality-of-life initiatives, including \$250,000 to fund a new facility for El Pasoans Fighting Hunger.
