Since 1987, the Cimarron Foundation has supported charities and initiatives that focus on El Paso and the surrounding region. To date, the Foundation has made gifts and commitments of \$4.5 million to over 380 recipients, including charities in healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, and quality-of-life initiatives. In 2002, Cimarron made 81% of its gifts to local charitable causes.

In 2003, the Cimarron Foundation made contributions and new commitments totaling \$901,559. Of the total annual contributions made, 85% were given to El Paso recipients. Of the 2003 commitments made, 95% were to local causes.

As part of its 2003 commitments, the Cimarron Foundation has pledged to give \$250,000 to Texas Tech Health Sciences Center–El Paso, with matching grants by the Paso del Norte Health Foundation. This commitment is in support of student scholarships at the new Texas Tech Medical School in El Paso.
