Hunt Family Foundation Annual Report For 2006

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation has supported charities and initiatives that focus on El Paso and the surrounding region. Over the past nineteen years, this charitable entity has made gifts and commitments of \$9.65 million to over 400 recipients. Charitable giving by the Hunt Family Foundation is focused on healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development.

So far in 2006, the Hunt Family Foundation has made contributions and new commitments totaling \$1,547,000. Of the total annual contributions made, 95% has gone to El Paso recipients.

As part of its 2006 commitments, the Hunt Family Foundation pledged to give \$100,000 to Keystone Heritage Park as part of the Foundation's ongoing mission to improve the quality of life in El Paso. A \$100,000 commitment was made to the Humane Society of El Paso for the construction of a new facility. And in keeping with the Foundation's focus on secondary education, St. Clement Episcopal School received a commitment for \$500,000 for the school's proposed Center for Excellence. We are also proud to be a donor to UTEP Athletics, with a \$100,000 commitment towards the new Foster-Stevens Basketball Complex.
