

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation has supported charities and initiatives that focus on El Paso and the surrounding region. Over the past 22 years, this charitable entity has made grants and commitments to over 550 recipients. Charitable giving by the Foundation is focused on healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development.

For 2009, the Foundation made contributions and new commitments totaling \$4,890,863. 2009 contributions totaled \$2,065,993, with 94.9% directed toward the Paso Del Norte region.

As part of its 2009 commitments and in keeping with its ongoing mission to improve healthcare in the region, the Foundation awarded \$500,000 to The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, and \$1,500,000 to

the Texas Tech Health Sciences Center in El Paso to endow a Chair in the Department of Psychiatry. Addressing its focus on education, the Foundation made a \$100,000 commitment to provide El Paso-area students with scholarships to attend St. Paul's School in Concord, NH, and it also made a \$25,000 commitment to the Ysleta Education Foundation. The Foundation awarded the USO a \$50,000, five-year commitment to support their "Operation Home Away From Home" program, a quality-of-life initiative at Ft. Bliss. A \$50,000, five-year commitment was also made to Centro de Salud Familiar La Fe, for their Magoffin Villas housing initiative in downtown El Paso. Promoting economic development, the Foundation made a grant of \$1,000,000 to UTEP for the Texas Research Incentive program, which resulted in a partial-matching grant by the State of Texas for \$750,000.
