

# HUNT FAMILY FOUNDATION ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2010

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation (the "Foundation") has supported charities and initiatives that focus on El Paso and the surrounding region. Over the past twenty-four years, the Foundation has made grants and commitments to over 550 recipients. Charitable giving by the Foundation is focused on healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development.

For 2010, the Foundation has made annual contributions and new commitments totaling \$20,065,059. Of the \$1,239,804 in annual contributions, 85.4% was directed toward the Paso Del Norte region. As part of its ongoing mission to improve healthcare in El Paso, the Foundation awarded a multi-year commitment of \$10 million to the Texas Tech University Health

Sciences Center to create the Gayle Greve Hunt School of Nursing and also issued a commitment for \$500,000 to the Paso del Norte Children's Development Center. In keeping with its focus on education, the Foundation has made a \$1 million commitment to provide scholarships to students attending El Paso Community College. The Foundation awarded the YWCA El Paso del Norte Region a \$1,200,000 seven-year commitment in support of their "Be-Y Miracles Happen" campaign. Promoting economic development and education, the Foundation has made a commitment of \$5,000,000 to The University of Texas at El Paso for the Hunt Institute for Global Competitiveness. As a quality-of-life initiative, the Foundation has pledged \$250,000 towards the Interactive Water Feature project at the El Paso Zoo.
