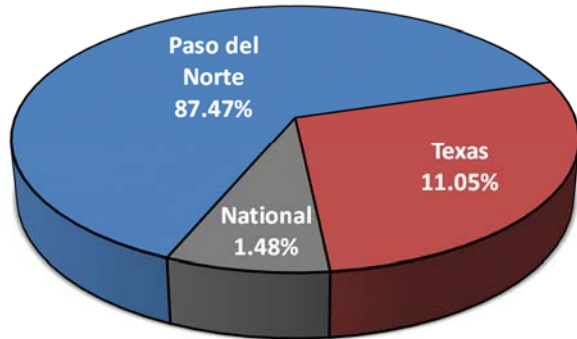


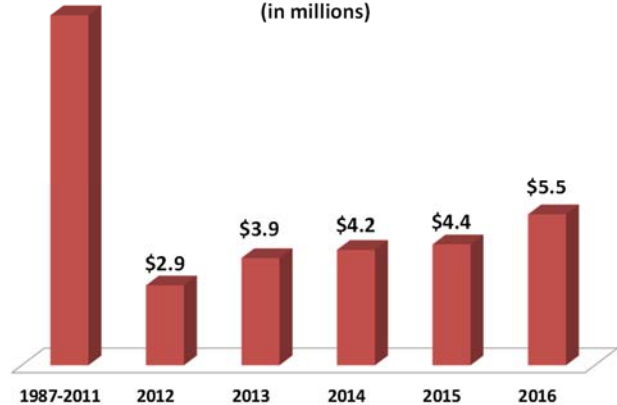
**MISSION & HISTORY**

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation (the “Foundation”) has predominantly supported charitable organizations and initiatives that target the areas in and around El Paso County, Texas, Doña Ana County, New Mexico, Otero County, New Mexico, and Ciudad Juárez, Chihuahua, México (the “Paso del Norte” region). The Foundation also supports organizations whose programs impact the state of Texas, and the nation as a whole. Charitable giving is focused on healthcare, education, the arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development. This report was prepared to provide transparency to the communities we serve.

**LONG-TERM GIVING**

Since inception, the Foundation has made grants and commitments to various organizations totaling \$84,940,000. To promote program sustainability, we award multi-year commitments to charitable organizations with a widespread and prolonged impact. To encourage community participation, the Foundation often makes multi-year commitments whereby we match private contributions made to charitable organizations.

**2016 YEAR IN REVIEW**

Twenty new multi-year commitments were made in 2016 totaling \$31,535,550, of which 18 target the Paso del Norte region. New commitments included \$25,000,000 to the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center of El Paso to establish the Woody L. Hunt School of Dental Medicine. To further our commitment to quality-of-life initiatives, the Foundation made a \$500,000 matching grant commitment to the El Paso Museum of History Foundation. To advance improvements in economic development, the Foundation made a \$2,500,000 commitment to the New Mexico State University Foundation to support the efforts of the Hunt Center for Entrepreneurship at Arrowhead Center at New Mexico State University.
