
#### MISSION AND HISTORY


Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation (the "Foundation") has predominantly supported charitable organizations and initiatives that target the areas in and around El Paso County, Texas, Doña Ana County, New Mexico, Otero County, New Mexico, and Ciudad Juárez, Chihuahua, México (the "Paso del Norte" region). The Foundation also supports

organizations whose programs impact the state of Texas, and the nation as a whole. Charitable giving is focused on healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development. This report was prepared to provide transparency to the communities we serve.

#### **LONG-TERM GIVING**

To promote program sustainability the Foundation awards multi-year commitments to organizations with a widespread and prolonged impact. Since inception, the Foundation has made grants and commitments to various organizations totaling \$40,072,542. To encourage community participation, the Foundation continues to make multi-year commitments whereby they match private contributions made to charitable organizations.

## 2013 YEAR IN REVIEW

Sixteen new multi-year commitments were made in 2013 totaling \$1,265,000, all of which target the Paso del Norte region. We are attempting to increase our impact in Southern New Mexico; as a result, new commitments were made to the following organizations in New Mexico: the New Mexico State University Foundation-College of Engineering, Doña Ana Community College, and Southern New Mexico SEMAA. Several commitments were made that supported economic development, including \$250,000 to support the efforts of the Borderplex Bi-National Economic Alliance Foundation.
