



2017 ANNUAL REPORT

MISSION & HISTORY

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation (the "Foundation") has predominantly supported charitable organizations and initiatives that target the areas in and around El Paso County, Texas, Doña Ana County, New Mexico, Otero County, New Mexico, and Ciudad Juárez, Chihuahua, México (the "Paso del Norte" region). The Foundation also supports organizations whose programs impact the state of Texas, and the nation as a whole. Charitable giving is focused on healthcare, education, the arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development. This report was prepared to provide transparency to the communities we serve.





LONG-TERM GIVING

Since inception, the Foundation has made grants and commitments to various organizations totaling \$97,122,000. To promote program sustainability, we award multi-year commitments to charitable organizations with a widespread and prolonged impact. To encourage community participation, the Foundation often makes multi-year commitments whereby we match private contributions made to charitable organizations.

2017 YEAR IN REVIEW

2018 BUDGET: \$8,000,000

Seventeen new multi-year commitments were made in 2017 totaling \$13,471,000, of which 16 target the Paso del Norte region. New commitments included \$12,000,000 to the Council of Regional Economic Expansion and Educational Development to improve K-12 education and, by extension, economic development. To further our commitments to quality-of-life initiatives and education, the Foundation made an \$800,000 commitment to the El Paso Zoological Society. To continue our support of the arts, the Foundation made a \$175,000 commitment to the El Paso Symphony Orchestra to assist in the expansion of its programs.
