

Hunt Family Foundation Annual Report for 2007

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation has supported charities and initiatives that focus on El Paso and the surrounding region. Over the past twenty years, this charitable entity has made grants and commitments to over 435 recipients. Charitable giving by the Foundation is focused on healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development.

For 2007, the Foundation has made contributions and new commitments totaling \$2,332,724. Of the total annual contributions made, 89.5% have gone to El Paso recipients.

As part of its 2007 commitments, the Foundation awarded St. Clement's Episcopal Parish School a \$500,000, five-year commitment to support quality education in El Paso. Medical Center of the Americas Foundation was also awarded a \$500,000, five-year matching commitment to be used to help create a premier medical center. The President's Chair Endowment for the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center in El Paso received a contribution of \$150,080 this year. A three-year, \$75,000 commitment was made to the El Paso Inter-Religious Sponsoring Organization (EPISO) for leadership training aimed at meeting needs for job training, education, and healthcare advocacy in the colonias. Finally, in maintaining its focus on regional economic development, the Foundation made a \$50,000 commitment to TransPecos/El Paso Regional Center of Innovation and Commercialization for assisting regional entrepreneurs.
