Hunt Family Foundation Annual Report for 2008

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation has supported charities and initiatives that focus on El Paso and the surrounding region. Over the past twenty-one years, this charitable entity has made grants and commitments to over 470 recipients. Charitable giving by the Foundation is focused on healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development.

For 2008, the Foundation has made contributions and new commitments totaling $\$_{1},6_{17},3_{88}$. Of the total annual contributions made, $8_{9}.1\%$ have gone to the Paso Del Norte region.

As part of its 2008 commitments, the Foundation awarded Keep El Paso Beautiful a \$100,000 five-year commitment towards improving the quality of life in El Paso through community

cleanup and recycling programs. The Foundation contributed \$130,750 towards its total pledge of \$500,000 to the Medical Center of the Americas, as part of its ongoing mission to improve healthcare in El Paso. The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center Paul L. Foster School of Medicine at El Paso received \$118,090 as part of a \$1,500,000 commitment towards the recruitment and compensation of a President for the medical school. A \$100,000 five-year commitment was made to the El Paso Symphony Orchestra, which reflects the Foundation's support of the arts in El Paso. And, in keeping with its focus on education, the Foundation also made a total commitment of \$60,000 over five years to the Community Scholars program for paid leadership development internships for El Paso area high school students.
