

# Hunt Family Foundation Annual Report for 2011

Since 1987, the Hunt Family Foundation (the "Foundation") has supported charities and initiatives that focus on El Paso and the surrounding region. Over the past twenty-five years, the Foundation has made grants and commitments to over 560 recipients. Charitable giving by the Foundation is focused on healthcare, education, arts, local heritage, quality-of-life initiatives, and regional economic development.

For 2011, the Foundation has made annual contributions and new commitments totaling \$5,012,754. Of the total annual contributions paid, 81.2% was directed toward the Paso Del Norte region. As part of its ongoing mission to improve healthcare, quality-of-life, and economic development in El Paso, the Foundation awarded a

multi-year commitment of \$1 million to the University Medical Center Foundation for the Children's Hospital, \$250,000 to the Medical Center of the Americas Foundation and \$60,000 was awarded to the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas. In keeping with its focus on education and the arts, the Foundation has made a commitment of \$150,000 to Kids Excel and \$1 million commitment to the El Paso Museum of Art. The Foundation awarded a matching grant of \$250,000 to the Paso del Norte Group Foundation in support of their dedication to promote economic development in the region.
